In response to a number of positive cases reported in School during w/c 20 September 2021, additional measures have been introduced, in line with the School's Outbreak Management Plan: - The School is keeping a log of positive cases, and teachers are using seating plans to assist NHS Test & Trace with contact tracing as required. - Contacts between year groups is to be limited for a 1 week period, with a return to more of a bubble system. - Robust cleaning measures remain in place. - All pupils are encouraged to take a Lateral Flow Test at home, and to keep an eye out for any symptoms. 2	Coronavirus	COVID-19 circulating in the wider community.	 Step 4 of the government's roadmap to recovery commenced on 19 July 2021. The school anticipates that it will essentially return to 'business as usual' from September 2021, while having in place an Outbreak Management Plan to deal with a local outbreak situation. The school will continue to follow government guidance on COVID-19 control measures, including: ensuring good hand and respiratory hygiene for everyone. maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes. keeping occupied spaces well-ventilated. following public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19. The Local Authority/Director of Public Health will manage local outbreaks and advise schools of measures they should take. 3	Coronavirus	COVID-19: pupils, parents or visitors with COVID-19 symptoms or a positive test	As at 28/09/21 there are 3 positive PCR tests in Y6, 6 positive PCR tests in Y5, 1 positive PCR test in Y3, two positive PCR tests in Reception and 1 positive PCR test among staff. The school will continue to offer asymptomatic staff twice- weekly tests until at least the end of September 2021. Families who are asymptomatic and wish to test regularly at home can order kits on line or pick them up from pharmacies. Pupils, staff and visitors should not come in to school if they have symptoms of COVID-19 (however mild), have had a positive test or are required to stay at home (e.g. quarantining). - Anyone developing COVID-19 symptoms at school will be sent

5	Coronavirus	COIVD-19: transmission via contact	 Robust cleaning protocols will continue, with additional cleaning of toilets and communal contact points in the middle of the school day. Furthermore, cleaning materials will be available in classrooms, and ipads will be sanitzied with wipes after use by the children. The school will continue to promote and supervise good hand and respiratory hygiene practices during the school day among pupils.
			3. Heavily shared resources (e.g. ipads and some toys in Nursery) have been identified and are routinely sanitized.
6	Coronavirus	COVID-19: transmission via aerosol droplet	During the current outbreak, staff will be wearing a face covering in communal areas. Visitors into School must wear a face mask. Ventilation will continue to be optimised (e.g. by opening skylights and windows). The school will continue to promote good respiratory hygiene
			practices in school ("Catch it, Bin it, Kill it"). Robust cleaning protocols will continue.
			While the wearing of face masks is no longer advised by the government, we are asking parents/carers to wear a face covering outside at congested times (e.g. school pick up). Following a risk assessment, some staff may choose to wear one in certain situations in school.

8	Coronavirus	characteristics. Visitors to Site	Visitors to site are being restricted to the bare minimum for one week. No parent activities are taking place during this week. Parents/carers are encouraged to correspond via telephone or email where possible rather than attend in person.
			Please do not come into school if any household member has symptoms of COVID-19, or has had a positive COVID-19 test. Please continue to wear a face covering if coming in to school, and at busy times outside (e.g. at school pick up).
9	Fire Evacuation		The Fire Evacuation muster point has permanently been changed to the school field alongside the Astro pitch. All signage has been changed accordingly. A practice evacuation is held at least once each term.
10	Cleaning		The school will continue with a robust cleaning regime, with an additional clean of toilets and communal contact points in the middle of the day. In addition, each teaching space will continue to be provided with cleaning materials to facilitate additional cleaning during the day.
11	Remote education - via Showbie		Online learning, via Showbie, is available for pupils currently self-isolating (but that who are well). The Senior Leadership Team continue to explore opportunities to enhance the remote education offering via its online learning platform (Showbie).
12	School Trips		No school trips are taking place during week commencing 27 September, and swimming lessons have been cancelled this week.
13	First Aid		In addition to the Medical Room facilities, a basic First Aid kit will be retained in each classroom.
14	Catering Service		During week commencing 27 September 2021: - Year 5 and Year 6 will have lunch served to them in their classroom. - Years Reception to Year 4 will have lunch in either the Hall or Dining Room, with each year group seated at separate tables. Tables will be spread out to limit close contact. - Nursery pupils who will continue to be served hot meals in the Nursery.
			During week commencing 27 September 2021: After School Care - snacks for Years 3-6 will be provided in the Hall (with Year groups separated as much as possible). Snacks for Years 1 and 2 will be in the Dining Hall (with Year groups separated as much as possible). Snacks for Nursery and

15	Staff Shortages Pupil Drop Off and Pick Up	Staff requried to self- isolate meaning that we are short of staff on site	 Reception will be in the Nursery (with Year groups separated as much as possible). There will be no inter-school fixtures or match teas this week involving Year groups with positive cases. A perspex screen is permanently in situ along the front of the Servery. The self-serve salad bar has been replaced with pre-prepared mixed salads, with a different topping offered daily. Staff are encouraged to engage in the national vaccination programme. They are also encouraged to engage in all of the other protective measures in place. The School will aim to put in place the necessary contingency measure to ensure pupils are adequately educated and supervised. Parents are politely reminded to keep their distance from others at drop off and pick up, and not to come into school if possible. Drop Off: each Year group will have an allocated drop off point (to minimise congestion): Junior pupils (Y3-6) will continue to be dropped off at the bottom of the Lower car park, where staff will be on hand, and proceed to the Netball Court.
