Dear Parents,

We have arrived at the end of our first half of the Spring Term and the children have enjoyed a fun-filled Charity Day today. The Prep children looked brilliant in their wide variety of costumes and even some of the Juniors were inspired to dress up given the theme of Technology, Science Fiction and Fantasy. This year's assembly was taken by a roller blading minion who later went on to visit all the Prep classrooms and the Nursery. It was wonderful to see so many gestures of kindness and appreciation from all ages within our RPS community from teachers, colleagues, catering and cleaning staff, friends and parents.

Following this, our Year 6 boys came third in the recent In2Hockey county competition at Dean Close. Looking ahead, we look forward to our UTI boys' hockey team travelling to Taunton for their IAPS Regional tournament and the UTI girls competing at the regional hockey tournament at Millfield in March having qualified as county champions last term.
