Dear Parents,

The Summer Term inevitably brings the most joyous events to school and it is only after the final assembly is done and everyone goes their separate ways that we are able to take stock of all that has happened and look forward to all that awaits.

We have had many fantastic highlights including the 'We are going on a Bear Hunt' Nursery production, the Prep 'Eddie the Penguin' show, the Year 3 and 4 'Bumblesnouts Saves the World' production, Prep and Junior Sports Mornings, a number of informal music concerts, the Year 6 French residential trip, the Year 5 PGL trip, day trips to Cotswold Wildlife Park, Toddington Railway, Perrygrove Railway, Caerleon Roman Villa and the Corinium Museum, to name just a few! **Uniform:** When we return in September, the children will be allowed to wear either summer or winter uniform until half term and this reflects the fact that the weather can vary widely during these Autumn months. The second hand uniform team will be running a sale on Monday 4th September from 12 – 2pm. We have taken a decision to continue with the Junior Department coming dressed in Games kit for the days where they have a Games or PE lesson. We will trial this until half term at which point we may revert back to coming in to school every day in uniform and changing for games if they need to. There will be a separate correspondence explaining which days your child will require games kit.
