The Richard Pate School is owned and operated by Pate's Grammar School Foundation. It is a successful independent day school for 3-11 year olds. We offer children a broad education in modern, purpose-built facilities. The School has an excellent record of admissions to both grammar and independent schools, with approximately 50% moving on to grammar schools and a large number gaining scholarships to independent schools. The School also provides a broad education and a varied extra-curricular programme.

Music is a core curriculum subject and we are very fortunate to have a bespoke music teaching and performing space, incorporating three practice rooms. To enhance the music offering at the school, we have a number of Peripatetic Music, Drama and Dance teachers providing pupils with individual and small group lessons. Pupils have the opportunity to build performance confidence, and showcase their progress, through participation in concerts, shows, assemblies and exams.

We are seeking an outstanding Peripatetic flute teacher to deliver imaginative and inspiring flute lessons to pupils, helping to improve their performance skills, and build self-confidence.

This is a part-time post, for a suitably qualified self-employed Peripatetic flute teacher to join us from September 2025. There is flexibility on days, depending on room availability.

To be successful in this role you must be:

- A suitably qualified and experienced flute teacher, able to engage and inspire pupils.
- Highly organised, with high expectations of achievement and behaviour.
- Committed to the vision of the department, and to the School's aims and values.
- Committed to the safeguarding and wellbeing of pupils, and comply with key school policies (e.g. Safeguarding, Health and Safety, Behaviour).
- Able to communicate effectively with pupils, colleagues and parents

Job Description

To deliver imaginative and inspiring flute lessons to pupils at The Richard Pate School, ensuring that effective learning takes place and pupils make excellent progress and build their performance confidence.

Key responsibilities

- To plan, promote, organise and deliver engaging individual and small-group flute lessons to pupils, ensuring effective learning takes place.
- To set high expectations which inspire, motivate and engage pupils, and improve pupil attainment.
- To make flute playing accessible for all pupils, regardless of ability, and set appropriate challenge for all pupils.
- To work with pupils to use flute playing as a means of personal and social development.
- To use regular assessments to monitor progress and set targets.
- To maintain/establish positive behaviour for learning.
- To prepare pupils for performances, examinations and auditions as appropriate.
- To maintain regular communication with parents, to report on progress and achievements.
- To actively support concerts and music events at the school, liaising closely with the Head of Music.
- To set fees, in consultation with the Head of Music, and be responsible for invoicing and processing payments directly with parents/guardians.
- To understand and adhere to the School's Safeguarding, Health & Safety and Behaviour policies.
